## POSTGAME NOTES

### Game 8: Oregon 3, Tennessee 1

- The Oregon Ducks eliminated Tennessee from competition with a 3-1 win in Game 8 of the Women's College World Series.
- Oregon advances to play top-seeded Cal at 8:30 CT tonight. The winner will advance to the semifinals.
- Oregon improved to 45-17 overall and 2-3 in the WCWS (making its second appearance).
- Saturday was the first time that Oregon has scored against Tennessee since 1989. The Lady Vols shut out the Ducks in the last two meetings, 5-0 in 2008 and 1-0 in 2006. The all-time series is now tied at 2-2.
- Oregon's Samantha Pappas hit a home run on the second pitch of the game to give the Ducks a 1-0 lead. Pappas is seventh in UO career home runs with 29.
- Pappas' home run was her 10<sup>th</sup> homer of the season, just one shy of her single-season-high (11 last year).
- Oregon's Kaylan Howard hit her 16<sup>th</sup> double of the season in the first inning, moving into second place on the Ducks' single-season list. She is tied with Sari-Jane Jenkins (16 doubles in 2007), two shy of the top spot.
- Oregon junior pitcher Jessica Moore tied the school record for career wins by recording her 73<sup>rd</sup> victory this afternoon. Katie Wiese (1989-91) finished her career with 73 wins.
- Moore threw a complete game, allowing one run (earned) on four hits and a walk while striking out four).
- Moore is now 11-6 in career postseason games and has 16 wins against top-25 teams this season.
- Tennessee closed the season with a 52-14 overall record and fell to 12-10 all-time in the WCWS.
- Tennessee went 0-2 in the WCWS for the first time in its five appearances. The Lady Vols were previously unbeaten in the first round before losing to Alabama on Thursday.
- Today's loss was Tennessee's fourth straight in the WCWS. The Lady Vols lost two straight to UCLA in the championship series in their last WCWS appearance in 2010.
- Tennessee gave up multiple runs in the first inning in both of its losses in the 2012 WCWS. Alabama scored four runs in the first frame in Thursday's opening round, while Oregon scored two in the first inning today.
- In her last game at Tennessee, senior catcher Ashley Andrews scored the Lady Vols' lone run on an RBI single by outfielder Tory Lewis in the second inning. The RBI was Lewis' first in the NCAA tournament this season.
